Since then I have considered several titles such as, "Ten-Ten Times", "Ten-X Extra", etc etc...then in January correspondence from Howard-W6QIR (Ten-Ten President) mentioned that he had been approached on the same subject. Some more 10-10 Chapters are now extinct do to non-reporting to the 10-10 Co-Ordinator for over one year. In the case of the Red River Valley Chapter, CH John-N5FJ told me that interest in nets and activity had dropped to zero causing him to declare that Chapter extinct. If your net is just a boring session of check-ins, why not consider adding a mission to your get togethers (such as: handling traffic, storm watches, UFO information, weather reporting, etc etc) and thereby re-juvenate your chapter's net.

Bill - WB60MH (10-10 Awards Manager) tells me that he is still getting bar applications with 10-10 numbers ONLY! He must have the 10-10 number, call letters, handle and QTH. QTH must include the City & State. Bill also stated, "I am consistently getting up to 400 numbers at one time. DX stations are allowed to send 200 and stateside stations (& Canada) are only allowed 100 per submission (per the rules set-up by the late W4JO)." "That does not mean 100 today and 100 tomorrow." You should wait for Bill's OK before you submit your next 100. So please play the game fair and give Bill some breathing space in his big job.

Timothy - WD9DZV, after reading my article on my new Avanti 5X10 Antenna, wrote to me to say that he has conversion information to convert the Avanti PDL II from 11 meters to 10. Words from the President

In the Winter Bulletin, I mentioned several changes among the various 10-10 managers. I thought I had covered all bases, but hadn't. There was one that took place before I was elected president, and I overlooked it. There were two others that were made after I had sent Chuck my copy, and just before the Bulletin went to press. Fortunately, we were able to get all three into the list on page 31.

The change I had forgotten to mention was in the eighth call area, where Les Reinhart, W8ATK, was succeeded by Tom Running, KA8BMD. Les had been presiding over the eighth call area for more than two years, had done an outstanding job, and will be missed. Tom is a worthy successor, and we look forward to working with him. Tom's picture was on page 23 of the Winter Bulletin.

In the seventh call area, Ron Jones, WB7ADO, had a change in jobs that proved to be very time-consuming, and to involve being away from home quite a bit. It made his 10-10 work difficult to fit in, and he arranged a replacement, who is Bobbie Vaughan, WB7NUU. Ron has been handling the 7's for two or three years, now, and Bobbie will have her hands full with that gigantic area, which runs all the way from Alaska to the Mexican border.

Well over a year ago, the late WólRY, who was DX Manager, was taken seriously ill, and KóPJO, Jim Melrose, took over what he expected to be a very temporary assignment. Like many other 'temporary' assignments, this one dragged on and on, and it wasn't until the end of the year that we found a replacement. That replacement is Harry Syring, WBIFTQ. Harry is a Nutmegger, and his location in Connecticut gives him more frequent access to many of our DX members than is the case for someone out here in six-land. However, the changeover is not without its problems. Although Harry's name and address are the only ones listed on page 31, mail service to our DX members is slow, and many will continue to send correspondence to Jim, who will handle it as long as he can. Meanwhile, we encourage our members who get inquiries from DX operators to refer them to Harry.

Awards Manager Bill Risher, WB60MH, continues to have a couple of problems among the applications sent to him. One is the lack of complete information on log entries sent in for Bars. Bill mentioned this in the Winter Bulletin, but it will do no harm to repeat here that you must submit, for each contact claimed, the 10-10 number, call sign, handle, and location. And don't forget the SASE!

The other problem has to do with call sign changes. There are just too many that go unreported for too long. Although Bill gets a copy of the latest listing every three months, even that cannot be completely correct. One thing I try to do (but must admit I sometimes forget) is to ask anyone I work who has a 1 x 2, 2 x 2, or 2 x 1 call sign, whether his 10-10 number was issued to that call sign or to one held earlier. If the latter is the case, I make a note of it on the list I send to Bill when I apply for another 100 Bar. One other thing to keep in mind: any contest or QSO Party produces a mountain of applications for Bars and other awards, and they continue to come in for some time after the event is over. This one was no exception, and Bill is swamped. Just be patient. It's a matter of first come, first served, and Bill does such a thorough job it takes time.

One of the things I've been meaning to do is to make some comment about the dedication of the 10-10 members who act as control stations for the daily net. The same ones are there, week after week, year after year in some cases, on 28,800 at 1800Z, Monday through Saturday. At the present time the control station operators are W6ANK, W6RNX, K6PTF, W6DFM, and W4WHM. In the past, there have been others of the same dedication. As you can see, most are here in 6-land, so when I check in, as I try to do daily, it's usually via relay through the courtesy of someone across the country.

Two others we have a lot to thank for are Chuck Elliott, chairman of the Rules and Ethics Committee, and Bob Watson, chairman of the Contest Committee. Chuck's committee had the job of setting up the rules for the QSO Parties, and Bob organized the Tabulation Committee which actually checked the logs and tabulated scores. Chuck, W8URK, and Bob, WA2MHL, worked in close cooperation in establishing the rules for the Summer QSO Party, which you will find elsewhere in this issue. If there are any further changes or notices, you'll find them in the summer issue. I don't anticipate that there will be any, but in this business, you never can tell what is going to happen next.

I tried to get in as much time during the last QSO Party as I could, and did manage a couple of hours, all told. Like many of you, I also had other obligations, so was unable to spend as much time as I wanted to in the contest. Bob tells me that there were more than 900 logs submitted, which makes checking them and tabulating the scores a tremendous task. That task was complicated, of course, by the wide variety of logs sent in, and by the fact that propagation was good, resulting in some very large numbers of contacts shown on a number of logs. Maybe you won't agree with some of the rule interpretations, but keep in mind that the people doing the tabulating are volunteers, and are not getting paid for the hours they are diverting from their own operating time in order to review the logs and tabulate the scores.

I've talked with Bob on the air, and he has told me some of the problems his group has run into. Here are a few:

- *Some logs are just plain illegible. If you can't be bothered to write your contest log so that it can be read, don't bother to send it in. I've suggested that such logs be ignored.
- *Some chapters waited until all members had sent logs to one local individual, then submitted these in bulk. Bob has no objection to the chapter mailings, but would like them divided into two or more mailings, so that the whole bunch doesn't wait for the very last one and then come in late.
- *I find this one difficult to believe, but some actually sent in original station logs and then failed to include a return SASE!
- *The clarification of the time worked rule was made because some sent in logs that showed bits and snippets of time on the air, and added these up into hours. It wasn't a violation of the rule as it then read, but was very hard to check. The revision will simplify checking, and doesn't do anyone a disservice.

That's all for this time. See you in the summer.

How to become a Ten-Ten Member

Work ten present members on 10 meters. Log each 10-10 number, call sign, date worked, operator's name, and location. Submit this list to your Call Sign Area Manager, with 31 Registration Fee and 33 for your first year's dues. Novices need not pay Registration Fee, and Novices and DX applicants need work but 5 present members. You will receive a Certificate and be assigned a permanent 10-10 Number. You must pay annual dues to remain in good standing, receive the Quarterly 10-10 International News, and participate fully in 10-10 activities.

How to earn Bars and Plaques

As a member, log the 10-10 numbers of stations you work on 10 meters. You may wish to mark your Roster to avoid duplicates, and to develop a filing system to record 10-10 contacts. All contacts must be bona-fide number exchanges on the air. When you have 100 contacts (including your first 10), list 100 only (never more, never less, and no duplicates) as follows:

- 1. Your list must be in serial order of 10-10 numbers.
- 2. You may submit only one list at a time.
- 3. You may not submit log books or copies of log book pages.
- 4. You must give your name, address, call sign, and 10-10 number and state which Bar you are requesting (i.e., 100 Bar, 200 Bar, etc.).
- 5. You must enclose an SASE (large size about 4 1/4" x 9 3/8").
- 6. Mail your materials to: Wm. (Bill) Risher Jr. WB60MH Awards Manager 10542 Loch Avon Drive Whittier, CA 90606

When you have attained your 500 Bar, you will be assigned an Honorary V. P. Number, and will be entitled to participate in additional activities. In addition, plaques are awarded for 1,000, 2,500, and 5,000 10-10 contacts.

How to earn WAS

When you have worked at least one 10-10 member in each of the 50 states, and have QSL card confirmation, mail your cards to WB60FF (address above), and apply for the 10-10 WAS Certificate. Enclose also an alphabetic list of the states, with full information on each station worked, plus \$1.08 return postage.

Chapter Activities

Many 10-10 chapters issue certificates which may be earned by following rules established by those chapters. See "A Guide to 10-10 Nets" for days and times when chapter nets meet. Groups wishing to create local chapters may get information from Chapter Coordinator Connie Hauck, K6EXQ, 794 W. 23 St., Upland, CA 91786.

Is it That Time?

Look at the mailing label on this issue of your Quarterly Bulletin. In the center of the top line there is a four-digit number which tells you the expiration date of your Ten-Ten membership. The first two digits indicate the month, and the last two the year. If your membership has expired or is about to expire, RENEW NOW. Send your \$3.00 annual dues to your Call Area Mgr. If you are more than three months in arrears, you must pay a \$1.00 Reinstatement Fee. RENEW NOW!

QSO Parties are open to all amateurs, but only 10-10 members are eligible for awards. All contacts must be made on 10 meters. Modes acceptable are AM, SSB, FM. QSO Farties are not intended to demonstrate technical or contest andurance abilitles, but to encourage interest in 10 meter operation. Members may submit 10-10 numbers collected for Bar awards; non-members may use them to qualify for 10-10 membership.

RITING

- 1. Exchange call, city, state, name, and 10-10 number.
- All station logs must be in UTC.
- l. A station may be counted only once.
- h. An operator may credit his/her score only to a local chapter of which he/she is a member. A local chapter is one that can be worked on ground wave when the band is closed.
- 5. One may work any 24 hours of the LS hours available. They need not be consecutive, but must be in a minimum of one hour increments starting with the first contact. Any portion of a clock hour must be counted as a full hour. Example: you operate from 01302 to 02292. This counts as two hours of operation.

CLASSES OF OPERATION:

- Single operator.
 QRP (20 watts PEP output 338; 10 watts output AM).

MORING:

1. Each contact is worth one point, 2. Add an additional point if the station has a 10-10 number,

In each class, a first place certificate to each U, S. call area, KL7, NH6 and other U. S. Pacific islands; each VE district, Central America and the Caribbean; South America; Surope; Africa and South Atlantic; Asia; Australia; New Zealand and South Pacific.

Logs are accepted from members only, and are due by August 20, 1980.
Mail to Robert Watson, 2 Suffolk Ct., Oceanside, NT 11572. Each entry on log must include call sign, date, time, QTM, name, 10-10 number (if any). Submit separate cover sheet showing your name, call, QTH, 10-10 number, chapter affiliation (if any), total hours of operation, contacts, and total number of points claimed. Logs not properly sub-mitted may be rejected. Chapters submitting bulk mailings must divide them into two or more mailings, spaced several days apart.
